Modernization

Alberta Infrastructure has announced a Modernization for W.R. Myers. This is essentially Phase II for the entire complex. Phase I was an update of D.A. Ferguson several years ago.

At this time, we are in the early organizational phase of this project. Architects are in the process of obtaining plans of our current building before any discussions or initial planning occurs.

When the brainstorming begins, we will look to get feedback from parents, students and staff as to potential changes and upgrades.

Alberta Infrastructure is proposing that the modernization will include the Band room, Library, 3 Story (including cafeteria), X-wing and Shop. We have also proposed that these

upgrades must include the Foods room that is used by both D.A. Ferguson and W.R. Myers.

The footprint of the school will remain the same (same exterior dimensions), but will include updating the entire building (windows, ceiling, floor, electrical, air handling...).

Although timelines can change, Architects are projected to be working with the school until Nov 2024. These plans then need to be approved by the AB Government.

Typically, infrastructure projects that are approved for the architecture stage are approved for construction, but there are checks and balances in the process. Our hope is that construction will begin during the summer of 2025 with an optimistic completion date scheduled for the fall of 2027.

The initial projection is that somewhere between \$30 to \$40 million will be spent on this project.

REBELS Athletics have gotten off to a great start for the 2023/24 school year. Myers has 4 fall sports on the go this year.

GOLF: Two Myers athletes competed in the Golf Zone Tournament. Zack Fehr and Evan Abela both competed on a cold windy day at Henderson Lake Golf Course in Lethbridge. Both battled the difficult elements and finished strong.



CROSS COUNTRY: The Zone Meet for Cross Country takes place in Pincher Creek on Oct 11. Myers is planning on sending a strong team of over 10 runners who hope to qualify for provincials. Good Luck REBELS!

FOOTBALL: The football team has had a very strong start to the season starting with a record of 4-1. Highlights include the first win over Cardston in nearly 20 years and a solid win over CCH from Lethbridge. The team is lead by a strong group of grade 12 leaders. The team is ranked in the top 5 province wide in their classification and are hoping to claim their 2nd Zone Championship in a row later this year.

VOLLEYBALL: For the first time in many years Myers has a Varsity Boys Volleyball team. Last year the only boys team was a JV squad. The team is growing and now there are two REBELS boys volleyball teams.

The High School Teams (JV and Senior) compete in the toughest league in Southern Alberta and are progressing nicely. The highlight of the regular season will take place on Oct 30 when the Senior boys and girls face off against cross town rivals St. Marys in the regular season finale. Last year the REBELS swept the night winning both the boys and girls games. This year we hope to do the same!

The Tier 1 Girls team has also gotten off to an excellent start going 3-0 in Divisional play as well as starting the year off strong in tournaments. The girls are hoping to repeat as Divisional and Zone Champions this year. The team has won 2 zone banners in a row and hope to win a third in early November.

Grad Update


